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
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
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Editor's Note: For all scripture verses, italics are used to indicate words (such as *and*, *he*, *therefore*, *so*, etc.) that were added to the text for clarity. In addition, all quotations from the Old Testament are shown in italics.

HOW TO USE THIS BOOK

This book has some unique features. Take this example:

The four columns on the left represent the four gospels and their narrators. Picture Matthew, Mark, Luke and John all sitting with us around a table, all telling the story of Jesus. In this example Matthew, Mark and Luke all wrote about Jesus' baptism; John did not. (John chimes in after Jesus was baptized). Now notice the verse numbers. Matthew's account can be found in the book of Matthew, starting in chapter 3, verse 13. Mark's account is in chapter 1, verse 9. Get it? If there is no verse reference, then that writer made no mention of this exact piece of information, (which does not imply it didn't happen, only that they did not mention it).

The large section of text to the right is the story from the Bible. In our example the first line is green to indicate Mark is speaking. As he is speaking, "It came to pass in those days," Luke adds, "when all the people were baptized." This is in blue to let you know that Luke provided this information. "That Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee, and was baptized by John in the Jordan." is narrated by Mark, but a quick glance to the left shows that the same or very similar information was also written by Matthew and Luke in their Gospels. Now Matthew adds, "And John tried to prevent Him, saying, 'I need to be baptized by You, and are You coming to me?'" The yellow text tells you Matthew is speaking, and a glance to the left shows you that this material is unique to Matthew's gospel story.

The result is a single account providing **ALL** the information in all four gospels, and in **chronological order**, as the events occurred. As you are reading and notice the color of the Bible column change, imagine this as one narrator pausing and another picking up the story.

He carried his own cross and went out of the city.

On the way they found a man named Simon. He was from the city of Cyrene and

was coming into Jerusalem from his home in the country. He was the father of Alexander and Rufus. As he was about to pass by,

the soldiers forced him to carry Jesus' cross.

A large crowd followed Jesus. The women in the crowd cried and sang funeral songs for him.

Jesus turned to them and said, "You women of Jerusalem, don't cry for me! Rather, cry for yourselves and your children! The time is coming when people will say, 'Blessed are the women who couldn't get pregnant, who couldn't give birth, and who couldn't nurse a child.'

They gave him a drink of wine mixed with a drug called gall. When he tasted it, he refused to drink it.

Then they crucified him.

Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them. They don't know what they're doing."

It was nine in the morning when they crucified him.

They crucified two criminals with him, one on his right and the other on his left.

And the Scripture was fulfilled which says, "And He was numbered with transgressors." (NASB)

Pilate wrote a notice and put it on the cross. The notice read, "Jesus from Nazareth, the king of the Jews."

Many Jews read this notice, because the place where Jesus was crucified was near the city. The notice was written in Hebrew, Latin, and Greek.

The chief priests of the Jewish people told Pilate, "Don't write, 'The king of the Jews!' Instead, write, 'He said that he is the king of the Jews.'"

Pilate replied, "I have written what I've written."

When the soldiers had crucified Jesus, they took his clothes and divided them four ways so that each soldier could have a share.

His robe was left over. It didn't have a seam because it had been woven in one piece from top to bottom.

The soldiers said to each other, "Let's not rip it apart. Let's throw dice to see who will get it."

In this way the Scripture came true: *"They divided my clothes among themselves. They threw dice for my clothing."* So that's what the soldiers did.

Then they sat there and kept watch over him.

The people stood there watching. But the rulers were making sarcastic remarks. They said, "He saved others. If he's the Messiah that God has chosen, let him save himself!"

Those who passed by insulted him. They shook their heads and said, "You were going to tear down God's temple and build it again in three days. Save yourself! If you're the Son of God, come down from the cross."

The chief priests and the scribes made fun of him among themselves in the same way. They said, "He saved others, but he can't save himself.

Let the Messiah, the king of Israel, come down from the cross now so that we may see and believe.

Let him come down from the cross now, and we'll believe him. He trusted God. Let God rescue him now if he wants. After all, this man said, 'I am the Son of God.'"

The soldiers also made fun of him. They would go up to him, offer him some vinegar, and say, "If you're the king of the Jews, save yourself!"

Even the criminals crucified with him were insulting him the same way.

One of the criminals hanging there insulted Jesus by saying, "So you're really the Messiah, are you? Well, save yourself and us!"



Later, by the Sea of Tiberias, Jesus showed himself again to the disciples. This is what happened.

Simon Peter, Thomas (called Didymus), Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two other disciples of Jesus were together.

3 Simon Peter said to the others, "I'm going fishing." They told him, "We're going with you." They went out in a boat but didn't catch a thing that night.

4 As the sun was rising, Jesus stood on the shore. The disciples didn't realize that it was Jesus.

5 Jesus asked them, "Friends, haven't you caught any fish?" They answered him, "No, we haven't."

6 He told them, "Throw the net out on the right side of the boat, and you'll catch some." So they threw the net out and were unable to pull it in because so many fish were in it.

7 The disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It's the Lord." When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put back on the clothes that he had taken off and jumped into the sea.

8 The other disciples came with the boat and dragged the net full of fish. They weren't far from the shore, only about 100 yards.

9 When they went ashore, they saw a fire with a fish lying on the coals, and they saw a loaf of bread.
