Brief Overview of Koya Life

The Koya people mostly live in the forests, valleys and hills on both sides of the Godavari River, located in the eastern part of India. Unlike many of the other people groups of India, the Koya are bilingual, speaking their native tongue, Koyi and the state language Telugu. Many of the Koya are farmers or field laborers. Although farming is difficult for those who live in the forests. The Koya people are excellent hunters and gather forest produce to supplement any vegetables grown in their own gardens. They practice mostly their own ethnic religion in addition to worshipping the Hindu gods and goddesses. For one of their primary goddesses, Gangaleamma Jadhara, they hold a seven day festival each year, and every three years they offer a human sacrifice to the goddess. They do not believe in an afterlife. Drinking and immoral living is very common amongst the people, especially at festivals.

Vision To Reach Koya

Pastor Prasad, his wife (a nurse), son and daughter are committed to bringing the Gospel and making disciples amongst the Koya people. They have goals to see them no longer dying of simple diseases and starvation, but through a relationship with Christ thriving and making wise choices that will alter the course for future Koya generations.

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
